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**B12 PROPOSAL TO CREATE ALCOHOL PROHIBITION ZONE AND ALCOHOL FREE ZONE AT COFFS HARBOUR JETTY FORESHORES**

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**Purpose:**

To seek Council approval for the creation of permanent Alcohol Prohibition Zone and Alcohol Free Zone at Coffs Harbour Jetty Foreshores.

**Description of Item:**

Correspondence (attached) from the CEO of the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club and A/Superintendent of Coffs/Clarence LAC prior to the Christmas/New Year period 2005/06 highlighted an area of concern for the Yacht Club and Local Police. Both parties advised that during the months of December and January there was a marked increase in the number of alcohol related crimes and incidents within the Jetty Foreshores, primarily associated with the area surrounding March's Carnival and the reserve and car parks between the carnival and Coffs Harbour Yacht Club.

A meeting was held on 7 June 2005 between Coffs/Clarence Police and Council staff to discuss the issue. Coffs Harbour Police confirmed that alcohol related incidents were a problem, within the area marked on the attached map. Whilst March's Carnival was strongly promoted as an alcohol free event, the Police advised that they had limited powers to deter alcohol consumption in this area and also advised that the reserve and dunal system to the east of the carnival had become an area where the abuse of alcohol and related crimes had become prevalent. On New Years Eve 2004 several assaults and robberies, upon Yacht Club patrons departing New Years Eve celebrations, were reported. The assaults and robberies were all attributed to intoxicated persons not involved with the Yacht Club celebrations.

The Police sought to have the reserve lands identified on the attached map designated as Alcohol Prohibited Zones and the roads and carparks identified on the attached map designated as Alcohol Free Zones.

## **B12 Proposal To Create Alcohol Prohibition Zone And Alcohol Free Zone At Coffs Harbour Jetty Foreshores ...(Cont'd)**

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The issue was referred to the Harbourside Project Team for feedback on the proposal to create a Special Event Alcohol Prohibited Zone and a Special Event Alcohol Free Zone between 1 December and 31 January. The Harbourside Project team supported the proposal provided that any future plans for the area would not be affected by the zones.

The Special Event Alcohol Free Zone and Special Event Alcohol Prohibition Zone were approved by Council at the 6 October 2005 meeting. Consultation with the public, local businesses and the Police showed unanimous support for the implementation of the zones. The Special Event Zones operated over the 2005/06 Christmas/New Year period between 1 December 05 and 31 January 06.

Feedback was sought from local businesses and the Police who indicated that there was a dramatic reduction in alcohol related crimes (see attached letter from P Barrie, Superintendent, Coffs/Clarence LAC) compared to the previous year and that the reduction was a direct result of the Alcohol Free and Alcohol Prohibited Zones.

It is now recommended, due to the initial success of the zones, that they be implemented on a permanent basis. The recommendation has the full support of the CHYC and the Coffs Clarence LAC.

### **Sustainability Assessment:**

- **Environment**

Litter generated by the drinkers in this area impacts upon the coastal environment and also poses a safety risk for park users. Broken glass is of particular concern given the close proximity to the beach and beach access points. The regenerated dunal area is also being impacted upon by drinkers accessing the area.

- **Social**

The Coffs/Clarence LAC has identified this area as having a high alcohol related crime rate. The community impacts of alcohol abuse and associated crime are well documented and any steps taken to reduce the impact would be of benefit to the greater community.

- **Economic**

#### **Broader Economic Implications**

Alcohol abuse and associated crime have a negative impact upon the greater community and is detrimental to the economic development of an area, particularly one which relies upon tourism as a major income generator. Implementation of the zones will assist Police in reducing the negative impact of the alcohol abuse.

#### **Management Plan Implications**

Funding has not been allocated in the current budget for the implementation of the zones, however, costs will be met through income generated within the State Park.

## **B12 Proposal To Create Alcohol Prohibition Zone And Alcohol Free Zone At Coffs Harbour Jetty Foreshores ...(Cont'd)**

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### **Consultation:**

The issue was referred to the Harbourside Project team, the local Police, The CHYC and Council's Administration Branch and all were supportive of this proposal.

### **Statutory Requirements:**

It is proposed that Council use powers granted under the Local Government Act 1993 (S644, 644A, 644B, 644C, 645, 646, 632) to prohibit the taking of and/or consumption of alcohol at this reserve and adjoining roads and carparks.

### **Issues:**

The Alcohol Prohibition zones are not subject to public consultation however, the creation of the Alcohol Free Zones would be subject to public consultation which will be undertaken once approval to proceed is given. Alcohol Free Zones operate 24 hours/7 days for the nominated duration of the Zone and will require renewal on it's expiry. It is recommended that the Alcohol Prohibition Zone be established to reflect a 8.00pm to 10.00am timeframe. The Alcohol Prohibition Zone will have no nominated expiry date.

### **Implementation Date / Priority:**

1 July 2006

### **Recommendation:**

#### **That:**

- 1. Council seek public consultation on the creation of Alcohol Free Zones in the areas identified on the plan attached to this report.**
- 2. Provided the public supports the creation of the Alcohol Free Zone, Council implement the 24 hours/7 days per week Alcohol Free Zones from 1 July 06 to 30 September 08 and 8.00pm to 10.00am Alcohol Prohibition Zones effective 1 July 2006.**

**Re: Request for consideration of Alcohol Free Zone --  
Coffs Harbour Yacht Club**

I refer to recent discussions between Acting Sergeant Virginia Luskan of Coffs/Clarence Licencing Unit and Paul Jolly, Chief Executive Officer of Coffs Harbour Yacht Club regarding the above issue.

Advice and comments were sought from this command by Mr Jolly in relation to the proposal of imposing an Alcohol Free Zone and/or Alcohol Prohibited Area to include an area within a 500-meter radius of the Yacht Club between sunset and sunrise.

Attached are crime statistics that have been collected for the period 1.1.04 to 31.3.05 for areas bordered by Jordan Esplanade and Marina Drive, Coffs Harbour. A further analysis of this data was also conducted to identify alcohol related incidents which were linked to the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club and surrounding areas.

It is the opinion of this command that alcohol prohibition signage enables proactive enforcement, which assists to preserve the safety and good order of the location and nearby areas, therefore strong consideration should be given by Coffs Harbour City Council to erecting Alcohol Prohibited signage in the nominated areas.

I trust this information will be of assistance to the council in considering Coffs Harbour Yacht Club's request.

## Alcohol Related Incidents

Statistics were collated in relation to the number of alcohol related incidents that have occurred in the vicinity of the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club, Jetty Foreshores and adjacent park land for the period from the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2004 to the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005.

### Assault

5 alcohol related assault incidents occurred between the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2004 and the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005. All of these incidents occurred in the months of December 2004 to February 2005. Three out of the five incidents occurred during the day between the hours of 5am and 11am.

### Move On

11 alcohol related move on incidents occurred between the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2004 and the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005. The majority of these incidents occurred during January and February 2005 (10 incidents), with 7 incidents occurring during the early hours of New Years Day 2005. The majority of move on incidents occurred during the hours of 2300-0100hrs.

### Person Search

5 alcohol related person search incidents occurred between the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2004 and the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005. All of these incidents occurred during January 2005, with 3 incidents occurring during the early hours of New Years Day 2005. The majority of person search incidents occurred during the hours of 0000-0100hrs.

### Resist/Hinder/Assault Officer

5 alcohol related resist/hinder/assault officer incidents occurred between the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2004 and the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005. All of these incidents occurred during the early hours of New Years Day 2005.

### Sexual Offence – Assault

Four alcohol related sexual offence – assault incidents occurred between the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2004 and the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005. Three of these incidents occurred in January 2005 and one in April 2004. The majority of these incidents occurred at 2300hrs.

### Stealing

Four alcohol related stealing incidents occurred between the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2004 and the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005. Three of these incidents occurred in January 2005 and one in January 2004. The majority of these incidents occurred between the hours of 0100-0300hrs.

### Street Offence

Thirteen alcohol related street offence incidents occurred between the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2004 and the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005. Nine of these incidents occurred on New Years Eve/ New Years Day 2005 between the hours of 2100-0100hrs.

**ISSUE:**

Request from the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club for police comment on the establishment of an Alcohol Free Zone/Alcohol Prohibited Area at the Coffs Harbour Jetty precinct.

**BACKGROUND:**

Correspondence has been received from Mr Paul JOLLY, Chief Executive Officer of the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club. The letter outlines concerns held by the Board and Management of the club regarding the consumption and alleged misuse of alcohol by persons who regularly congregate in the Jetty Foreshores parkland and dune areas which are directly adjacent to the club premises.

**COMMENT:**

Mr JOLLY makes reference to "incidents" where he alleges that his departing members and guests have been verbally harassed and assaulted by alcohol affected persons in the car park and adjacent parkland. Crime statistics have been collected for the period 01.01.04 to the 31.12.05 for areas bordered by Jordan Esplanade and Marina Drive, Coffs Harbour. A further analysis of this data was conducted to identify alcohol related incidents which were linked to the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club, or incidents which occurred in locations adjacent to, or surrounding the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club. (See attached information)

On the 31 December 2004 the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club held a New Year's Eve function on their licensed premises. The Club management took responsible steps to enforce their security and entry requirements by erecting a 1.8 metre high cyclone fence around the perimeter of their defined licensed area. Licensed security guards were employed to check persons for proof of age and maintain a safe environment for members and their guests attending the club for their New Year's Eve celebrations. A number of alcohol related incidents occurred within close proximity to the Club in the early hours of New Years Day where patrons leaving the club reported being "set upon" by a group of intoxicated persons who had been consuming alcohol in the park and dune areas directly outside the club. Police also had reason to move along a number of alcohol affected persons who were carrying and consuming alcohol and causing other people in the vicinity to feel intimidated by their intoxicated behaviour.

Licensing Police met with Mr JOLLY in February 2005 where the events arising from the New Year's Eve function were discussed. A number of recommendations were discussed to overcome future alcohol related problems on and around the Yacht Club premises. The Management of the Club stated that they were willing to employ additional licensed security guards for major events. In addition they are willing to install flood lights in the car park and surrounding areas.


The Management of the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club have proposed that Coffs Harbour City Council consider imposing an Alcohol Free Zone and/or Alcohol Prohibited Area to include an area within a 500 metre radius of the Yacht Club between sunset and sunrise. It is widely accepted that these Local Government Act notices assist police to enforce alcohol prohibition time limits and reduce irresponsible consumption of alcohol. They also enable police to "move along" persons who may be alcohol affected from these public areas, thus reducing the potential for crimes to be committed. In the opinion of Police the alcohol prohibition signage enables proactive enforcement which assists to preserve the safety and good order of the location.

It has been noted that Local Government Act signs have been erected along Ocean Parade, between Park Beach Road and Fitzgerald Street, Coffs Harbour. These sign posted public areas where the consumption of alcohol is prohibited, include coastal dunes and parkland in the vicinity of the Park Beach Hotel Motel and the Park Beach Bowling Club. This locality is similar to the dunes and parkland areas surrounding Coffs Harbour Yacht Club with children's play equipment, picnic tables and beach access.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

That Coffs Harbour City Council gives consideration to erecting Alcohol Prohibited signage in the nominated areas in the vicinity of the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club.

**REF: REQUEST FOR CONSIDERATION OF AN ALCOHOL FREE ZONE**  
Within a 500m radius of the Coffs Harbour Yacht Club between sunset  
and sunrise.

The Board and management of Coffs Harbour Yacht Club formally request Coffs Harbour City Council consider our application for the establishment of an alcohol free zone within a 500m radius approximately of the Club building, up to and including including the jetty car park.

We have grave concerns regarding the use and abuse of alcohol in the area and feel it is our duty of care to offer our patrons and the wider public a safe place to enjoy outdoor activities and to protect them, as much as possible, from alcohol related harassment, verbal abuse, fear and petty theft.

In the past there have been incidents with people consuming large quantities of alcohol in the car park and adjacent parkland. When members and guests of the club leave the premises they have been verbally harassed, physically abused and had handbags snatched. These incidents have been beyond the control of club staff and hired security guards and it has been necessary to seek police assistance. We have been advised that under current legislation we are unable to stop anyone drinking alcohol in the area.

The club has installed additional outdoor lighting in an attempt to minimise the problem. The park and sand dune areas are densely covered with shrub and trees, providing cover for those persons who wish to use the area to consume alcohol.

As a preventative measure, the club is prepared to install temporary flood lights during major events such as New Years Eve and has requested to meet with police crime prevention personnel. However, we request that Council give due consideration to making the area an "Alcohol Free Zone" as the similar parkland and scrub area between the Park Beach Bowling Club and Hotel Motel has been zoned.

We trust Council will consider our application as soon as practicable and we look forward to your positive response to our request.

I refer to your recent letter to Sergeant Virginia Luskan of Coffs/Clarence Licencing Unit requesting feedback on the efficacy of the zones over the Christmas / New period.


An analysis has been carried out which compares the same period to the previous year when the zones were not in use. The analysis reveals a significant decrease in the number of anti-social and alcohol related incidents. This substantial reduction in crime is attributed to the implementation of the Alcohol Free and Alcohol Prohibited Zones.

Positive comments received by police from members of the public and Marches Amusement Operators endorse the success of the signage in providing a safer environment in the Jetty precinct.

The future use of Alcohol Prohibition signage by the Coffs Harbour City Council is highly recommended.

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**B13 SAWTELL BEACH RESERVE - MURRAY'S - ALCOHOL PROHIBITION**

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**Purpose:**

To recommend notices be placed to control the taking of and/or consumption of alcohol in the reserve Pt R 1002970 at the beach access in Twenty Second Avenue, Sawtell locally known as Murray's Sawtell Beach (north) and an Alcohol Free Zone be created over the adjoining section of Twenty Second Avenue, Sawtell, south of the intersection with Twentieth Avenue.

**Description of Item:**

Several residents in the locality of the beach entry stairs at Murray's have written to Council following repeated late night incidences involving persons affected by alcohol smashing glass and generally disturbing the quiet residential amenity into the early hours of the morning. The residents have requested a Alcohol Free Zone be created by Council over the locality.

The boundary of the road reserve of Twenty Second Avenue with the beach reserve starts approximately five metre's from the beach entry stairs and beach viewing platform. The adjoining road reserve area consists of a wide open gently sloping worn grassed area where vehicles park and the area is used to access the beach stairs. It is considered critical that alcohol is prohibited from this area of road reserve by creating a Alcohol Free Zone over the southern end of Twenty Second Avenue from the corner of Twentieth Avenue.

**Sustainability Assessment:**

- **Environment**

Broken glass is of particular concern given the close proximity to the beach and beach access point and beach viewing platform. Local residents put themselves at risk handling broken glass when cleaning up following late night disturbances involving alcohol. Installing alcohol prohibition and Alcohol Free Zone notices will have a minor impact on the locality visually.

- **Social**

A control on alcohol use in the beach reserve locality and adjoining road reserve will have a positive impact on the local residential area. The normal reserve user and local residents will be less likely to be confronted by intoxicated persons using these areas and smashing glass. Police will have powers to act to control alcohol use.

- **Economic**

**Broader Economic Implications**

Signage will be installed within current maintenance programs.

**Management Plan Implications**

The cost of installing Notices will be absorbed within current programs.

**Consultation:**

The Police have been consulted and Superintendent Peter Barrie of the Coffs/Clarence Local Area Command has written twice to Council fully supporting the proposal to control by notice alcohol on the beach reserve area off Twenty Second Ave access stairs and the creation of an Alcohol Free Zone on the southern end of Twenty Second Ave, Sawtell.

**Related Policy and / or Precedents:**

Council has previously used S632(1)(e) of the Local Government Act 1993 to prohibit the taking and/or consumption of alcohol in reserves controlled by Council between 9pm and 9am. Council has also used the Local Government Act 1993 ((S644, 644A, 644B, 644C, 645, 646) to create Alcohol Free Zones in roads and car parks.

**Statutory Requirements:**

It is proposed that Council use powers granted under the Local Government Act 1993 (S644, 644A, 644B, 644C, 645, 646, 632 (1) (e)) to prohibit the taking of and/or consumption of alcohol at this reserve location and adjoining road reserve area of Twenty Second Avenue south of Twentieth Avenue.

**'S632 Acting contrary to notices erected by Councils**

632 (1) A person who, in a public place within the area of a Council, fails to comply with the terms of a notice erected by the Council is guilty of an offence.

*Maximum penalty: 10 penalty units or \$1100*

- (2) The Terms of any such notice may relate to any one or more of the following:
- (a) the payment of a fee for entry to or the use of the land;
  - (b) the taking of a vehicle into the place;
  - (b1) the driving, parking or use of a vehicle in the place;
  - (c) the taking of any animal or thing on the land;
  - (d) the use of any animal or thing on the land;
  - (e) the doing of any thing on the land;
  - (f) the use of the land or any part of the land.'

Of these only (e) is relevant.

**Issues:**

The control of alcohol S632 (1) (e) Acting contrary notices erected by Council prohibiting Alcohol are not subject to public consultation however, the creation of the Alcohol Free Zones would be subject to public consultation which will be undertaken once approval to proceed is given.

**Cont'd**

**Implementation Date / Priority:**

Notices will be installed as soon as possible following Council's approval by resolution for the control of alcohol on part of the beach reserve and following public consultation for the Alcohol Free Zone on Twenty Second Avenue subject to public support being received.

**Recommendation:**

- 1. That Council using the powers granted by S632(1)(e) of the Local Government Act 1993 prohibit 'the taking of and/or consumption of alcohol within the Pt R 1002970 Murray's beach access, Twenty Second Avenue, Sawtell between 9pm and 9am'.**
- 2. That notices in accordance with the Act be installed in the location of Sawtell Beach North (Murray's beach access stairs) in Twenty Second Avenue, Sawtell.**
- 3. Council seek public consultation on the creation of Alcohol Free Zone in the area of Twenty Second Avenue, Sawtell identified on the plan attached to this report.**
- 4. Provided the public supports the creation of the Alcohol Free Zone, Council implement the 24 hours/7 days per week Alcohol Free Zones in Twenty Second Avenue, Sawtell, south of Twentieth Avenue.**
