Orara River Rehabilitation Celebrates 20 Years



The Orara River Rehabilitation Project, which is largely funded by Coffs Harbour City Council's Environmental Levy collected from ratepayers, is marking 20 years of on-ground environmental works that have helped create a healthy river and vibrant habitat.

Over the years, the EL funding has been used to secure grant funding and in-kind works, as well as to carry out a range of rehabilitation works on private, Council and Crown lands including:

- Weed control along the river banks;
- Exclusion fencing for livestock and provision of water troughs away from the river;
- Repair of eroded and former gravel extraction sites; and
- Planting in and around the river banks where natural regeneration is poor or non-existent.

"Not only have the works resulted in a rise in water quality, a growth in frog and fish species, a reduction in weeds and the development of natural habitat along the banks, but also the return of one of Australia's iconic animals – the platypus," said Coffs Harbour Mayor, Councillor Denise Knight.

"Everyone involved in the rehabilitation works over the years deserves to be congratulated."

The project is a rare example of a long-term rehabilitation project, with only one other Australian project known of a similar length.

It complements Council's existing weeds and bush regeneration programmes by:

- Conducting weed control along the riverbanks of the largest water catchment in the local government area;
- Focusing on private property rather than Council-owned or other public property;
- Covering up to 1,000 hectares in some years for weed control and approximately 500 hectares annually for regeneration works;
- Educating landholders on weed control and regeneration; and
- Working closely with Council's teams on weed control strategies and progress.

By helping improve the water quality of the Orara River, which is the main source of water for the Coffs Harbour community's drinking water, it helps reduce the amount of treatment the water requires.

Water is also a valuable resource for primary producers in the Orara Valley and the improvement to the river environment helps tourism and recreational fishing.

Experience the Thrill of the Queen's Baton Relay



Residents from Coffs Harbour can begin planning their Queen's Baton Relay (QBR) experience with the street-

After travelling an astonishing 288 days throughout the Commonwealth, the Queen's Baton will arrive onto Australian soil in Brisbane on 24 December 2017, having shared the dream of Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games (C2018) with over one third of the world's population.

From Christmas Day until 24 January 2018, the Queen's Baton will be shared with thousands of Australians at popular summertime events, iconic locations and children's hospitals around the country.

From 25 January 2018, the QBR will shift gears to a more traditional relay, where the Queen's Baton will celebrate Australia Day, before continuing in the hands of approximately 3,800 batonbearers through every state and territory.

As the Queen's Baton travels the length and breadth of Australia, the QBR will not just

pass through, but spend quality time in each community it visits, calling into hundreds of local schools and community celebrations along the way.

The Queen's Baton will arrive on the Gold Coast for the XXI Commonwealth Games Opening Ceremony on 4 April 2018, where His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will remove Her Majesty's message from the Baton and read it aloud to declare the Games officially open.

The Queen's Baton will arrive at City Square in Coffs Harbour's CBD at 5.30pm on 1 February 2018 after arriving at the harbour by helicopter, weather willing, and then travelling along Harbour Drive.

Batonbearers will be informed of their street-specific slotting location in December. Details will be updated at www.gc2018.com/qbr in the weeks prior to the Baton arriving into a celebration community.

"No one will want to miss out on experiencing the thrill of being part of the Queen's Baton Relay, the largest sporting event that Australia will see this decade, is just around the corner," said Coffs Harbour Mayor, Councillor Denise Knight. "So make sure you claim your spot for February 1 2018."
