## CONSTRUCTION OF UPPER SHEPHARDS LANE DETENTION BASIN TENDER NO. RFT-865-T0

Tenders are invited for the construction of an on-stream, zoned earth fill, 30,000m<sup>3</sup> embankment in west Coffs Harbour including 66m of 2.7M x 0.9M RCBC, upstream storage area, approach channel, downstream stilling basin and spillway.

OUTDOOR WATER USE EFFICIENCY**



Water restrictions apply to *all* consumers connected to the Coffs Harbour Local Government Area Water Supply, including Corindi Beach, Coramba and Nana Glen Town Water Supplies.

Water Restrictions apply to **ALL RESIDENTIAL AND NON-RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES** including public areas, sportsgrounds, commercial and industrial premises, hotels/motels, holiday apartments and caravan parks, schools, plant nurseries and market gardens.

Some Permanent Water Conservation Measures are:

- **Sprinklers and Fixed/Unattended Hoses banned between the hours of 9:00am to 4:00pm**
- **Building maintenance allowed with trigger nozzle hoses or pressure cleaners**
- **Hosing of driveways and paved areas banned except for health reasons, pressure cleaners allowed**

## History Mysteries

Local sleuths and history buffs are being sought who can shed light on some history mysteries for Coffs Harbour Regional Museum.

First of all, does anyone know how Gallows Beach, between Corambirra Point and Boambee Beach, earned its name? Did the name come from a surfer tradition or something a little more sinister? On another note - do you have any copies of Surfing World magazine from the 1960s with stories of our Coffs Coast beaches? The Museum staff would love to see them.

Council's history team is also seeking reminiscences, photos and any other

documented information about the old Police Station and Courthouse in which the Museum is now housed. It was in operation at 215 Harbour Drive from 1907-1930. It would be fascinating to hear from descendants of the police families who lived at the site, as well as accounts from the court officials.

In the 1920s, there was a two-storey house in Coffs Harbour referred to as Colderbrea. It had tiled fireplaces, beautiful timberwork and fruit trees. It was a rental property during the early part of the 1920s. Does anyone have

any memories or photographs they are willing to share?

Plus, in the Museum's extensive maritime history collection, there is a porthole encased in its original timber. It's believed to be from the wreck of the 780-ton Keilawarra which went down in 1886 near North Solitary Island with the loss of 41 lives after colliding with the smaller, southbound steamer, the Helen Nicholl. Do you have any information on this tragic shipwreck?

## Queen's Baton Relay Celebrations

Tomorrow (February 1) - the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games (GC2018) Queen's Baton Relay will arrive in Coffs Harbour.

The Queen's Baton will arrive at the Jetty Foreshores in a Rescue Helicopter before the 15 local batonbearers - who have been given the honour of carrying the Baton - will make their way to a free Community Celebration at City Square.

Everyone is invited to greet the Baton as it arrives at the Jetty Foreshores or line Harbour Drive and Jordan Esplanade to support our local batonbearers.

There will also be family entertainment at the Jetty Foreshores and City Square so everyone can come together and share in the spirit of the Relay and the Games.

Coffs Harbour Mayor Councillor Denise Knight said she was delighted that Coffs Harbour is hosting the GC2018 Queen's Baton Relay. "Hosting the Queen's Baton Relay is not only an exciting opportunity for us, it's a way to highlight and promote Coffs Harbour to people in Australia and the world who have been following the Queen's Baton extraordinary journey," she said. "It's also a wonderful way to celebrate the people that make our community great."

The GC2018 Queen's Baton Relay is the longest in history, travelling a record 388 days and 230,000km around the world. In Australia, the Queen's Baton is covering 40,000kms, travelling through every state and territory for 100 days.

The Gold Coast Games will be held between April 4-15. They will be the biggest event to be staged in Australia in a decade.
