EMERGENCY WATER CONSERVATION GUIDE



Critical danger water shortage

Schools, sportsgrounds and public gardens	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Recycled water can be used outdoors for watering- No use of town water allowed outside
Market gardens, orchards, nurseries and commercial flower gardens	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Approval from City of Coffs Harbour is required to use sprinklers, fixed, unattended and handheld hoses for a maximum of 30 minutes on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays- No watering with town water allowed at other times, or without approval
Swimming pools, spas and outdoor showers (including motels, resorts, parks etc)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- No topping up or filling of pools and spas allowed- No use of outdoor or beach showers allowed.
Vehicle washing <i>Category A – buses, taxis, food transport, ambulance and garbage vehicles.</i> <i>Category B – all other vehicles</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Category A vehicles need to apply for approval from City of Coffs Harbour to use hoses for a maximum of 15 minutes on Monday, Wednesdays and Fridays for health and safety reasons only- No use of town water allowed at other times or without approval- Category B vehicles only allowed to wash vehicles if required by law
Pressure and carpet cleaning, car detailing and under-boring	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- All activities require approval from City of Coffs Harbour
Paved public areas	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- No hosing or pressure cleaning, except where required by law
Building and new turf	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- All external building uses of town water require approval from City of Coffs Harbour- No use of town water allowed at other times or without approval- No watering of turf allowed
