The 2015 study is currently being reviewed by Council's Heritage Advisor (Louise Thom) with a view to refining the list of post-war houses to only include the "outstanding" examples of post-war housing. Progress has slowed since Covid, as Louise has limited her visits to Coffs Harbour. However, this will hopefully be back to normal soon. 	Educate and inform Council and the community through the promotion of the City's heritage resources: Similar initiatives, heritage strategy and	Noted, no action required.	N/A
	Oversee the implementation of the heritage fund: Council offers funding to the owners of properties that are either heritage listed or contained with the two heritage conservation areas at Sawtell and Coramba. This has previously been capped at \$1000 per property to try and accommodate as many landowners as possible. Heritage NSW provides \$ for \$ funding to Council to achieve this - up to \$5,500 per annum (during this current period). The fund is offered each financial year so the next round will commence in the next couple of months. The mapping displays both known and predictive Aboriginal cultural heritage as "blob" mapping (sites with a large buffer around them).
